

## FREE APPROPRIATE PUBLIC EDUCATION

It is the policy of the Pegasus School of Liberal Arts and Sciences to comply with the IDEA, which guarantees the provision of a free appropriate public education (FAPE) to all children with disabilities.

It is the policy of the Pegasus School of Liberal Arts and Sciences to ensure that all students with disabilities who are determined to be eligible for special ed services who are within the Charter School's jurisdiction have a FAPE available in accordance with its procedures as reflected in the Legal Framework for the Child-Centered Special Education Process located at:

<http://framework.esc18.net/> to the extent that legal framework reflects current law and applies specifically to public charter schools.

It is the policy of the Pegasus School of Liberal Arts and Sciences to ensure that an individualized education program (IEP) is developed, reviewed, and revised for each child with a disability who is determined to be eligible for special ed services in accordance with its procedures as reflected in the ARD MEETING legal frameworks of the Legal Framework for the Child-Centered Special Education Process, located at: <http://framework.esc18.net/> to the extent that legal framework reflects current law and applies specifically to public charter schools. It is the policy of the Charter School that each of its children with disabilities who is determined to be eligible for special ed services receives all of the special education, related services, and supplementary aids and services identified in the child's IEP.

It is the policy of the Pegasus School of Liberal Arts and Sciences to ensure that the need for extended school year (ESY) services for children with disabilities who are determined to be eligible for special ed services will be considered on an individual basis by the child's ARD committee, in accordance with its procedures as reflected in the EXTENDED SCHOOL YEAR SERVICES legal framework of the Legal Framework for the Child-Centered Special Education Process, located at: <http://framework.esc18.net/> to the extent that legal framework reflects current law and applies specifically to public charter schools. ESY will be provided to children with disabilities who are determined to be eligible for special ed services as determined by their ARD committee according to their IEP.

It is the policy of the Pegasus School of Liberal Arts and Sciences to provide a FAPE to children with disabilities who transfer from within and outside the State in accordance with its procedures as reflected in TRANSFER STUDENTS legal framework of the Legal Framework for the Child-Centered Special Education Process, located at: <http://framework.esc18.net/> to the extent that legal framework reflects current law and applies specifically to public charter schools.

Where required by law to do so, it is the policy of the Pegasus School of Liberal Arts and Sciences to provide a FAPE to expelled students who are eligible for special education services under the IDEA in accordance with its procedures as reflected in the DISCIPLINE legal framework of the Legal Framework for the Child-Centered Special Education Process, located at: <http://framework.esc18.net/> to the extent that legal framework reflects current law and applies specifically to public charter schools.
